Cyclists who use this road were amazed to find that the traffic signals have finally been switched on. When one of us forwarded the 'good news' email to a council engineer, he replied within 10 minutes. And it was 8.00 at night!

But work has now started on a scheme that didn't meet with ICAG's approval when we were consulted.

Basic Bike Maintenance

Our Latest Campaign

The Road Danger Reduction Campaign needs volunteers to help carry out observations in the morning or evening peak periods. The next spots we are targeting are Tollington Road/Holloway Road junction; Drayton Park/Holloway Road junction and Horsell Road/Fieldway Crescent junction.

We campaign to reduce road danger in Islington by highlighting the responsibilities motorists have to other more vulnerable road users.

Packington Estate

Consultation with the designers of this scheme has ensured that N-S & E-W routes were included. But the planned cycle lanes would not provide the necessary 0.5m width between the contra-flow cycle lane and on-street parking. There'll be a risk of being 'doored.' A suggestion was that cycle symbols were painted on the road rather than having a dedicated lane.

20's plenty!

We discussed a 20mph speed limit on non Tfl roads in the borough at the last meeting & agreed that ICAG will support all political parties that want a borough wide 20mph limit.

Colebrooke Row scheme

The plans for this are with us for consultation – no surprises. Pedestrians are to have a separate crossing. It remains to be seen how it works and when it is implemented. There are plans to improve the crossing all the way through to St Johns Street, though.
