Amwell Street Warning

This street is having extensive work done which will have started by the time you read this, with a scheduled finish time in mid October. Cyclists will be tempted to ride on the pavement – we hope ICAG members will not be among them.

Ten years ago...

"Council seeks closer relationship with ICAG" was the headline in Issue 18 Oct Nov 1999. We were invited to a workshop on the Cycling Section of the Interim Transport Plan for 2001/2002. History does not relate if this was repeated - although we do meet on a semi-regular basis with Council Officers about engineering issues.

Hornsey Rise

We revisited Hornsey Rise in August following works by the council to make this stretch of road safer for cyclists. We have long been concerned about northbound motor traffic in particular overtaking cyclists at speed and far too closely. The council have narrowed the road at some points, added cycle logos on the road and installed a 30mph Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) that flashes if a vehicle exceeds the speed limit. We noted that the sign flashed for approximately 20% of the motor vehicles indicating that a significant number still exceed the speed limit, putting cyclists at risk.

One particular hotspot was outside the Health Centre where cyclists frequently had to pull out to pass parked cars.

We also observed over the top of the hill, on the Haringey side, where the road has a 20mph limit. We think Islington should follow Haringey's example. At the moment the 20mph VAS installed by Haringey Council was flashing nearly all the time. It would make greater sense for all road users if the entire length of Hornsey Road was made 20mph.

Bike Buddying

Are you (or someone you know) nervous about cycling to work? ICAG have teamed up with Islington Council to offer a bike buddying. We have trained volunteer cycle instructors who would be willing to cycle with you on your route to work, helping you gain confidence to negotiate the traffic, and offering help on route options. Encouraging more cyclists -ICAG's video evidence

Islington Council's Sustainability Scrutiny Review Committee has been looking at how more people could be encouraged to cycle on the roads of the borough. As part of our submission we presented a short video of what it is like to ride a bike in Islington. The video highlighted many of the issues we have raised before: speeding traffic on Hornsey Rise; potential conflict on the Horsell Road/Fieldway Crescent junction; and the Holloway Road crossing at Fieldway Crescent and Madras Place. We also looked at permeability issues in the borough - one way roads or road closures which force cyclists onto circuitous routes. Some of these issues have begun to be addressed by the council. However engineering solutions can only work so far and we are calling on the council to take more action on education and enforcement. You can view the video here

Critical Mass

As we are anticipating the third London Freewheel, now London Skyride, it seems a good time to comment on a ride that predates Freewheel. Now in its 15th year, this ride has been leaving the South Bank every last Friday of the month. Chris Ashby has been leading a feeder ride from Islington Town Hall since January 2005. Initially the ride was a political statement embodied in its name "Cyclists Have a Right to Move" (CHARM). Over the years parts of London have been brought to a standstill by the sheer number of participants. Every rider has their own reasons for attending but Critical Mass is essentially an ongoing celebration of cycling.
