LCC AGM

The LCC's Annual General Meeting was a great social occasion and opportunity to learn more about the LCC's activities over the past year. Alongside the important campaigning wins, highlights included over 370 bike rides organised by 350 local group members as well as innovative bicycle recycling projects with community-based organisations.

The Guardian columnist Zoe Williams was guest speaker at this year's Annual General Meeting of the LCC. She entertained the audience with her trials and tribulations road testing the loudest bicycle horn on the market but also made serious points about the challenges of cycling on London's roads.

Islington cyclists were well represented at the LCC Board elections with 5 candidates out of the nineteen from Islington.

The most contested Board elections in LCC history resulted in the election of Mel Grech and Suzy Fogg (both from Islington), Rachel Aldred, David Love and Claire Wren. They join existing members Ann Kenrick, Rik Andrew, Mustafa Arif, Alastair Hanton and Tony Levene - a well-balanced Board that will be supporting the LCC to prepare the ground to make cycling a key voting issue in the 2013-2014 Borough elections. 3 Boroughs - 20 mph news

At an Executive meeting (18.10.12), Islington council decided to implement a 20 mph limit on all borough roads. They decided to do this in spite of opposition from the Police and TfL. Camden's Cabinet will discuss a similar scheme on 5 December 2012 and decide if the proposal is go to public consultation. Hackney Council passed a motion calling for 20 mph on all Hackney streets at their meeting on 21.11.12. Great news for cyclists!

Tufnell Park Cycles to School



This is a campaign started by ICAG veloteers to promote cycling and walking as part of children's daily routine. We propose a circular network of safe routes to school connecting six local schools and six play spaces. The 2 mile route would be subject to focussed improvements to prioritise the cyclist and the pedestrian, with special attention given to junctions, crossings and the environment outside of schools.

The campaign was launched on Saturday 10th November at the Tufnell Park Farmer's Market. We hosted a market stall while more mechanically minded ICAG volunteers provided a 'Dr Bike' service of free bike checks and repairs. The Camden Cycling Campaign was also represented. The day ended with a well attended family bike ride around the route that was completed by a range of cyclists of all ages. David Lincoln

Safer Lorries, Safer Cycling


