LCC activist conference Sept 9

Several ICAG members attended. The focus was ward level campaigning in the run up to the 2014 local elections. This fits in well with ICAG's activities and we are getting more used to working at ward level. (Bunhill: Bunhill Row, Highbury West: Connect2). Also I think that LCC are expecting ICAG to show the way.

It was slightly worrying that some of the audience of local campaigners didn't know who their local ward councillors were and I guess a lot more had never talked to them - but they've got 2 years to find out. A lot of other issues came out in the Q&A. A couple of long distance commuters pointed to the variable quality of long cycle routes that pass through several boroughs. How can we better serve long distance commuting cyclists that don't have any representation in the borough?

One parent apparently said in a vox pop on the Big Ride earlier in the year that he just wanted his kids to be able to cycle to school. This phrase was re-quoted at the meeting and it resonated with a lot of people especially a couple of teachers. We need to engage with parents. LCC wants to target the 600+ local wards in London but I wonder whether it would be better to focus on politically marginal wards?

Boris bikes for the rest of Islington?

At a Council meeting in June there was cross party support for expansion of Boris bikes into the rest of Islington. We've also heard that a barrier to this is cost - about £150-200,000 per docking station. The LibDems in Islington also ran an online petition for this expansion, which is now closed.



20 mph success?

A 20mph Limit on Islington's Principal Road Network was announced in late July. This completes the 20 mph on all Islington roads that we've been campaigning for; however there will be financial implications, so we don't expect this to be implemented immediately! TfL's Safer Junctions but not for us, yet Transport for London announced that they'd be making 50 junctions safer for walkers and cyclists by the end of 2013, possibly as a result of LCC campaigns. (Bow Flyover and Love London Go Dutch) 50 more will have work done "to be delivered after 2013." Junctions listed in Islington are Archway and Nag's Head Gyratories, Highbury Corner, 2 junctions with Farringdon Road (Clerkenwell and Calthorpe Street), and 2 junctions with Seven Sisters Road (Blackstock Road and Isledon Road). They are, sadly, all scheduled for after 2013.



Olympics

Several ICAG members took part in the Olympic Opening Ceremony on 27th July. Adrian Platt and Alison Dines (pictured in costume) were in the industrial revolution and NHS section respectively whilst Robert Harston, who works with the LSO, was assisting backstage. Meanwhile outside the stadium some ICAG members took part in the monthly Critical Mass ride and were amongst 120 cyclists arrested.
