20mph on Cycling Super Highway in Islington?

We have been consulted about the route and the improvements that are planned for Islington. There's a welcome suggestion for a 20mph speed limit on Holloway Road, otherwise nothing revolutionary! Other points are: using the island in the middle of Archway gyratory for northbound cyclists, 12 metre Toucan crossings at Whittington Park and Madras Place, an alternative route down Liverpool Road if the Highbury Corner Improvement doesn't go ahead.

Barclay Cycle Hire Bikes

I decided to sign up to the scheme. The fob arrived the next day by post and after a 3 minute registration process I was off. The bikes are a surprisingly good ride and lighter than their bulk suggests. The three gears are adequate if a little slow. There are many nice touches: numbered saddle heights so you can remember your setting and adjust the saddle quickly, impressively bright and always-on LED lights and the open pannier.

If you need a bike for when you are separated from your own, or a spare bike for guests, these are not Boris's or Barclays's bikes - they are yours. Enjoy! **CK**
