
Liveable Neighbourhood Bid - CI & LS Intervention with councillors & officers secures significantly improved bid for Caledonian Ward

QW2 - Council accept need to upgrade route - Consultation due in Q2








Future Route 2 - Tottenham Hale - Camden



- Major project bringing protected infrastructure to the largest E-W corridor in the borough.
- Includes Seven Sisters Rd, Isledon Rd, Tollington Rd, Camden Road, Penn Road, Hungerford Rd
- Multiple wards and many retailer groups, schools, and residents associations will be involved.
- Needs us to work with councillors, retailers, schools and civic society

















5 Asks from the Council



01	High quality Liveable Neighbourhood bid	 Liveable Neighbourhood projects (typically 1km21£1 - 10M) replace Mini Holland schemes (£20-30M). Designed to stimulate & disseminate best practice across London Ensure Islington councillors. officers and consultants understand best practice in London
02	Protected tracks on main roads	 Goal is 5km in 2 years and at least 10 km in this administration Learning how to engage councillors, businesses, communities requires practice Islington is out of practice on this.
03	Cycle parking	 Huge demand for more parking. Borough has lagged neighbours Hackney has 15x more hangars, Southwark (10x) New scheme includes administration and is more expensive than neighbours.
04	More Quick Wins	 Two way permeability for bikes throughout the borough Appropriate planning and process before installing anti-moped barriers Solving snags
05	A Quietway for the many	 Ensuring that the new Quietway was fit for purpose and not repeating the failed design principles of QW2 Reducing motor-traffic volumes with filtering on both Gillespie and Thornhill



High quality Liveable Neighbourhood bid	 Caledonian Ward bid is inline with Healthy Streets principles CI has written a letter of support
Protected tracks on main roads	 Target - 5 km in first 2 years. Delay to Clerkenwell Road / Old Street plan means that this is seriously under threat Overall goal for 4 years should be on track with delivery of FR2
Cycle parking	 18 implemented in Jan 2018 Now 72 Hangers with an additional 48 coming in March - Total 120 by year end Additional 1264 places for residents on estates with 800 for visitors Occupancy is on tracks and rising. additional 100 hangers planned per year.
More Quick Wins	 Two way permeability for bikes throughout the borough Appropriate planning and process before installing anti-moped barriers Solving snags
